



Extinct Moa of Aotearoa

There were once nine different species of moa living in forests, shrublands, and alpine areas across the motu. The largest was the female South Island giant moa; she could stretch up to a height of 3 m. She would lay a single egg, and her mate, a much smaller male, would hatch and care for the chick.

You can see two extremely rare complete moa eggs on display in the galleries, one in Southern land, Southern People and another in Nature.
